



2. Health and safety policy

Alongside associated procedures Health and safety, this policy was adopted by *Wigod Way Wallingford Family Centre* on *January 2023*.

Designated Health and Safety Officer is: Maureen Norton

Aim

Our provision is a suitable, clean and safe place for families, where they can grow and learn.

Objectives

- We recognise that we have a responsibility and duty of care towards those who work in and receive a service from our centre. Individual staff and service users also have responsibility for ensuring their own safety as well as that of others. Adherence to policies and procedures and risk assessment is the key means through which this is achieved.
- Insurance is in place (including public liability) and an up-to-date certificate is always displayed.
- Risk assessment is carried out to ensure the safety of children, staff, parents, and visitors. Legislation requires all those individuals in the given workplace to be responsible for the health and safety of premises, equipment and working practices.
- Smoking is not allowed on the premises, both indoors and outdoors. Staff do not smoke in their work clothes and are requested not to smoke within at least one hour of working with children. The use of electronic cigarettes is not allowed on the premises.
- Staff must not be under the influence of alcohol or any other substance which may affect their ability to work. If staff are taking medication that they believe may impair them, they seek further medical advice and only work if that advice is that the medication is unlikely to impair their ability to look after children. The centre manager must be informed.
- Alcohol must not be bought onto the premises for consumption.
- A risk assessment is carried out for each area and the procedure is modified according to needs identified for the specific environment.
- Risk assessments are monitored and reviewed by those responsible for health and safety.
